

WHAT ARE COLLEGES LOOKING AT?

Important Factors:

- Strength of curriculum (IB, AP, Honors)
- Grade Point Average (GPA) and class rank (percentile)
- College Entrance Examination Scores (ACT or SAT)
- Activities student is involved in

If the College Requires them:

- Essays
- Recommendation Letters (teacher and counselor)
- Resume (leadership, community service, extracurricular, talents, etc.)
- Interviews

PICKING A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY

FACTORS TO CONSIDER:

- Four-year, two-year, or vocational?
- Location: close to home or far away? City life or college town?
- Size: Under 3,000 students or over 30,000 students?
- Coed or single sex?
- Private or public institutions?
- What programs are offered?
- What sports or extracurricular activities are available?
- Cost? Do not exclude any choices because of high cost (Expensive schools often offer more aid)
 - ALWAYS CHECK THE NET PRICE CALCULATOR.

WHAT YOUR LIST SHOULD LOOK LIKE

At least 2 reach schools
At least 4 match schools
At least 2 REAL safety schools

Research the college's admission data on SCOIR or look at the college's website for the Common Data Set:

 most important facts and figures about a college that allows you to easily look up certain pieces of information, helps you compare colleges, and even provides demographic breakdowns of admissions and enrollment statistics.

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

- I. College or University (FIU, Harvard, UM)
- 2. Community College (MDC, Santa Fe)
- 3. Vocational/Technical (Robert Morgan, Lindsay Hopkins
- 4. Military (Army, Navy, Marines)

POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION

Community College: Why pick MDC over other colleges? Better financially, MDC Honors

Vocational/Technical: quick path into the work force

Military: apply EARLY and speak to Major Chavez (JROTC)



Programs of 6 months to full Bachelor's degrees designed for the student to either transfer into a four-year university, go directly into the workforce, or even go on to Graduate level studies.

Open admissions: anyone with a high school diploma or GED is admitted.

SAT/ACT not required: do need to be "placed" with either SAT/ACT or PERT (more about that later!)

Vast selection of programs including Graphic Design, Music Production & Management, Fire Science Technology, Nursing and much more.

MEET YOUR DEADLINES!

EARLY DECISION: binding October-November

UM's Early Decision Deadline: November 1st

EARLY ACTION: nonbinding (may be different for some schools)

- FSU Early Action Deadline: October 15th
- UM's Early Action Deadline: November 1st

REGULAR DECISION: varies as per college/university

- UF's **ONLY** Deadline: **November 1st** (SSAR complete by **12/1** & SAT/ACT scores must be received by **12/15**)***check website regularly
- FSU's Deadline: Dec. 1ST FOR ADMISSIONS & MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS
- FSU's Rolling Admission Deadline: March 1
- FIU's Merit Scholarship Deadline: November 14th

ALWAYS CONTACT EACH INSTITUTION TO VERIFY ALL DEADLINES!

APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

- I. Application: required everywhere
- 2. Transcript or SSAR
- 3. Application fee: (fee waiver(s) can be used, see me for more info.)
- 4. SAT/ACT Scores: required or test optional
- **5. Letters of Recommendation:** (if applicable)
- **6. Essay/Personal Statement:** (if applicable...share your voice!)
- 7. Copy of other Required Documentation: (if applicable)

DOUBLE CHECK WHAT EACH INSTITUTION REQUIRES OR REQUESTS!

TRANSCRIPTS

- Transcripts are being updated will be ready for request/upload via SCOIR approximately the 2nd week in September.
- All the fabulousness you all did over the summer is being added on DISTRICT-WIDE...this takes time. Once they are updated, GPAs & rank will be calculated & available.

- Florida school's online app? SCOIR
- Out of state school or Florida private school not listed on electronic listing found on our website? SCOIR
- UF, FSU, FAU, FGCU, UNF, New College, & FL PolyTech: complete the SSAR,




TRANSCRIPTS

SCOIR DEADLINES

- If applying to a school with a **November 1**st deadline or **EARLIER MUST** complete and request documents in **SCOIR** by **Sunday, September 18**th
- If applying to a school with a deadline AFTER

 November 1st you MUST complete and request documents in SCOIR by Sunday, October 2nd

PAY ATTENTION TO DEADLINES THAT ARE NEEDED FOR COUNSELOR ACTION!

APPLICATION PROCESS: HOW TO BEGIN

- 1. Sign up for SAT/ACT if you still need to do so.
- 2. Finish researching colleges and make your list/excel spreadsheet.
- 3. Involve your family (parameters) look at cost of attendance.
- 4. Go to the websites of each of the colleges or to the Common App or Coalition App and find the undergraduate freshman application. CREATE AN ACCOUNT AND NOTE THE USERNAME & PASSWORD IN A SAFE PLACE.

TYPICAL APPLICATION CHECKLIST

- Application
- ☐ Transcript or SSAR
- ☐ Application fee or fee waiver
- ☐ SAT/ACT scores (some colleges are test optional or test flexible
- ☐ Letters of recommendation from teachers/counselors
- ☐ Essay/supplemental essay(s) and short answers
- ☐ Copy of other required documentation (ex. FL residency)

COMMON APPLICATION ERRORS

- **Dishonesty:** Never lie on an application. This includes overstating grades, exaggerating about participation in activities, or plagiarizing an essay. **Remember, they will get your transcript!**
- **Getting the details wrong:** Since you may use some of the same essays and responses for more than one school, go over each draft carefully, making sure to insert the correct names and details. Then put the applications away for at least a day and go back over them with a fresh eye.
- **Sloppy or lazy preparation:** All applications are not the same. Follow the instructions for each college's application exactly. Have someone you trust proofread your work and never rely on spell-check.

- ACT scores range from 1
 to 36.
- English

- SAT scores range from 400 to 1600.
- Reading/Writing

FEE WAIVERS

- You must complete the MDCPS income survey: https://incomesurvey.dadeschools.net/
- If you are on free or reduced lunch or meet other eligibility requirements, you qualify for the following:
 - 4 ACT test waivers
 - 2 SAT Reasoning test fee waivers (and up to 2 more for Subject Area exams if needed)
 - 4 College Board College Application Fee
 Waivers...access these via YOUR College Board account
 - 4 ACT College Application Fee Waivers...
- Testing waivers used during your junior year count

SCHOLARSHIPS

- I. Institutional
- 2. State
- 3. Private

- You must SEARCH and APPLY for those private scholarships.
- Look into local scholarships, parents' place of employment, your churches and places of worship, local clubs & organizations
- Check CAP Corner on Cavs
 Connect FREQUENTLY

- Qualify early by testing early, applying early and meeting the institution's requirements for their merit based scholarships.
- In most cases these institutional scholarship offers are an automatic part of the application process...there are exceptions & requirements (i.e. deadlines, supplemental info, etc...) so always double check and research for each university!

INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Usually the most generous!

- **DISCOVER COLLEGES:** Learn more about which colleges could be a great fit for you, see the micro-scholarships they're offering, and share that you're interested.
- ADD YOUR ACHIEVEMENTS: Complete your RaiseMe Portfolio by adding each of your course grades, club involvement, sports, volunteer activities, and more.
- EARN MONEY: For each achievement, you'll earn a micro-scholarships from colleges you're following, the sum of which you'll be awarded when you attend that college.

INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Raise.Me

- Guaranteed scholarship if you meet all 3 requirements by graduation
 - 1. GPA
 - 2. College Entrance Exams
 - 3. Community Service Hours
- Must apply senior year prior to graduation, application opens
 October 1st
- Can access the scholarship money up to 5 years after graduation

STATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Bright Futures

- Private scholarships take a lot of work but are often are the deciding factor against student loans or can fill the financial need gap left over after all federal, state & institutional aid is awarded.
- Can be awarded as many as possible
- Some do take financial need into consideration, some do not

PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Put in the work to get the money

WATCH OUT FOR SCAMS!

HOW TO SPOT THEM:

- "Money back guarantee"
- Scholarships will cost some money
- Asking for credit card or bank account number please!
- "We will do all of the work"
- "You've been selected by a national foundation to receive a scholarship"
- "You're a finalist"

FINANCIAL AID

FAFSA: opens Saturday, October 1st

- If planning to start in summer 2023, complete the FAFSA the 2022-2023 FAFSA (currently available on the website) using 2020 tax info
 - everyone will complete the 2023-2024 FAFSA for funding from the fall 2023 through that academic year.

FINANCIAL AID: UNDERSTANDING THE LINGO

- COA: Cost of
 Attendance (aka student cost/student expenses)
- **EFC:** Expected Family Contribution. Calculated by a formula established by law.
- UNMET NEED: what's still missing?

COA: tuition & fees, books & supplies, room & board, transportation, living expenses

EFC: formula calculated by parent's income

Financial Need: how much money do you need to get to afford it?

Financial Aid Award: Any \$\$ awarded to you

Unmet Need (Gap): what's missing?

HOW IT WORKS

FINAL REMINDERS

- Keep your grades up
- Stay organized and keep a calendar with deadlines
- Sign up to take SAT/ACT and other required tests if necessary
- Send college applications and required documentation on time
- Apply for as many scholarships as possible
- Apply for Financial Aid after October 1st
- Keep photocopies/screenshots of all documents
- Check CAP Corner on Cavs Connect for updates
- Update your SCOIR profile

DON'T GET OVERWHELMED

College Applications can get very stressful. Remember:

- Don't underestimate yourself
- Ask questions and look up information
- Keep to your routines as much as possible
- Try to create a new, healthy habit for yourself
- Seek out support & stay social
- Adopt mindfulness and relaxation techniques
